

GPIB-USB-HS

To install the GPIB-USB-HS interface, connect the USB connector from the GPIB-USB-HS interface to an available USB port on your computer, as shown below. Before connecting the GPIB-USB-HS interface to GPIB devices, ensure that the computer and the GPIB devices are at the same ground potential¹. The GPIB-USB-HS interface connects directly to most GPIB devices without requiring a GPIB cable. If your computer is already running, the operating system automatically detects the GPIB interface. Otherwise, the GPIB interface is detected when you start your computer.





Caution ¹To connect to GPIB devices that do not share the same ground potential as the computer, use a GPIB bus expander/isolator or an isolated USB hub. Failure to isolate different ground potentials can damage the GPIB device, GPIB-USB interface, and computer.
